- Watch the King's Speech The tradition was actually started by the King's great grandfather, King George V, when he delivered the first address over the radio in 1932. George V's first message was written by English writer Rudyard Kipling and transmitted live from a studio that was created for him at Sandringham estate. Tune in to BBC1 on Christmas Day to watch this!
- Pantomine Pantomimes are a revival of old school Roman comedies like Lysistrata with slapstick humour and ridiculous jokes. There's plenty in the area, in Cardiff, Swansea and even LLanelli - why not try it out and see if you like it?!
- John Lewis Christmas Advert Yes, that's right, a TV Advert is a key part of the Festive time of year - A lot of people even think it isn't the Christmas season until the John Lewis Christmas advert is released.
