EMPOWERED STUDENTS





We have delivered opportunities for regional collaboration with a focus on our institutional strengths in order to support student starts-up and test trading in the region.





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(CO)-CURRICULAR DEVELOPMENT

- We have encouraged and supported our colleagues to embed entrepreneurship into the curriculum, including the ETC Toolkit to develop modules and share best practice.
- There are currently 17 modules focused on Enterprise and Entrepreneurship; in addition to other modules that empower entrepreneurship.
- We are reviewing our Academic Career Pathway to recognise Entrepreneurial teaching and engagement activities.
